Lindweld has been awarded First place at Shavshinsky Music Competition held in St.Petersburg. Artists who Lindweld has worked with include William Grant Naboré, Dang Thai Son, Ben Goetzke, Menahem Pressler, Jan Jiraceck von Arnim, Leif Ove Andsnes, Matti Raekallio, and James Giles.

Lindweld has been featured on Swedish National Television, Russian Radio and Norwegian National Television playing works by Rachmaninov, Liszt, Clara Schumann and Grieg. Lindweld has also appeared as a soloist and chamber musician on stages such as The Berwald Hall, The Grieg Hall, Kauffman Center for the Performing arts, The Royal Palace in Stockholm, Church of the Cross in Bergen and Poly Center for the performing arts in Shenzhen.

Lindweld was an artist in Residence at KODE Bergen from 2017-2018 which granted him weekly performances at the famous composers homes; Troldhaugen (Edward Grieg) and Siljustøl (Harald Sæverud).
